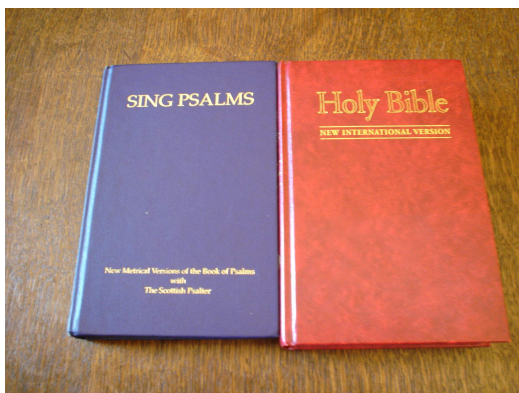

We warmly welcome you to our worship service today, especially if you are visiting with us. Please stay behind for tea and coffee after both our morning and evening services.

We are a congregation who are evangelical, reformed and Presbyterian. Our worship service consists of prayer, singing and preaching. The Minister leads the congregation in prayer twice during the service. We sing praises to God from the metrical Psalms. We use both the 1650 Scottish Psalter and a revised



version called Sing Psalms which was produced by the Free Church of Scotland in 2003. A Psalm book containing both versions is available at the door. We sing unaccompanied by musical instruments, but are led in singing by a man called the 'precentor'. We stand for our singing.

Our worship service lasts for about 75 minutes in total. The main part of that is given over to preaching a message from the Bible. The version of the Bible that we use in Leith Free Church is the NIV (New International Version). A copy of the Bible is available at the door. However, if you use another version of the Bible, do please feel free to use that instead.
